

## The Grange



The Green, York Road, Seacroft, LS14

### **Why is it important?**

The Grange is a 2 storey Grade II listed Tudor style building built in 1837

### **Building Description**

It is built using Ashlar and stone slate roof. The South East elevation is 4 bays wide, 2 bays deep and rear service wing. The South East front elevation has a projecting gabled bay on the right and projecting gabled 2-storey porch off-centre with flat hoodmould over doorway. There is a shield above with the door with a dragon's head and 3 lions' paws. There are stone mullion and transom windows, with dripmoulds. The South West elevation has 2 Dutch gables, smaller on the left, with ground-floor battlemented canted bay window. There are grouped octagonal chimney shafts. The wings to North and East also constructed using ashlar with stone roofs with coped ends. They have stone mullion windows and sashes with glazing bars. Internally the building contains the fine late C17 oak stair reputed to have been removed from Austhorpe Hall.

### **Current State**

The site is accessible on all sides, although there is overgrown vegetation and rubble around the building. As at the 2001 survey, the building can best be described as derelict with all openings boarded up. The roof is covered with corrugated plastic; there is evidence of damp all over the building and vegetation growing from various parts.

### **Current Owner**

The building is currently owned by St James Securities.
